# 2022 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

## 2022 Highlights

- COVID-19 testing continued throughout 2022. Added rapid antigen testing in September 2022.
- Began working on Health Department website complete revamp.
- Developed a Suicide Prevention billboard.
- Completed a Community Health Needs Assessment with Aspirus Langlade.
- Completed and began implementation of the Community Health Improvement Plan.
- Continued targeted outreach to underserved populations.
- Received a \$10,000 grant to increase radon testing in Langlade County.
- Developed a Branding & Communications Plan and strategy.
- Organized a spring Walk for Wellness with over 100 participants.
- Updated the Performance Management & Quality Improvement Plan.
- Formed a PMQI Team to ensure that performance management and quality improvement is integrated in LCHD.
- Completed the Community Outreach focused on increasing immunization rates.
- Conducted both walk- in flu vaccination clinics as well as drive through vaccination clinics.
- Partnered with AMI Expeditionary Healthcare to provide COVID-19 vaccination clinics on 5 occasions.
- Continued work in Health Equity.

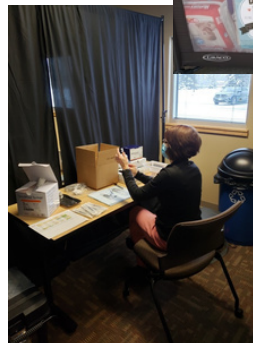

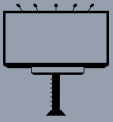
